## GREECE SEEKS EU AID FOR 100,000 REFUGEES

Greece has asked the EU for 480 million euros (\$534 million) in emergency funds to help shelter 100,000 refugees, the government said Tuesday, warning that the migrant influx threatened to overwhelm its crisis-hit resources.



### EU TO UNVEIL EMERGENCY AID PLAN

he European Union is preparing to spend hundreds of millions of euros on humanitarian aid, as Greece struggles to cope with an influx of migrants.

Under plans to be submitted on Wednesday, EU funds could be deployed within Europe in the same way they are used to help crises outside the bloc.

The UN has warned of a humanitarian disaster caused by a build-up of migrants on Greece's borders.

Thousands of asylum seekers remain trapped on the border with Macedonia. The plan to be submitted by the EU's executive body, the European Commission, means EU aid agencies would for the first time work directly with the UN and other groups inside Europe, rather than dispersing money to individual member states.

EU officials said the aid plan would allocate 300m euros (£233m; \$325m) this year to help any EU state deal with the migration crisis. In all, 700m euros would be made available over three years.

However, BBC Europe correspondent Chris Morris says that even if such funding can be deployed quickly, the EU also needs to stem the flow of new arrivals. That would mean better cooperation with Turkey, he adds.

### **EUROSTAT: EURO AREA UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AT 10.3%**

The euro area (EA19) seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate was 10.3% in January 2016, down from 10.4% in December 2015, and from 11.3% in January 2015. This is the lowest rate recorded in the euro area since August 2011. The EU28 unemployment rate was 8.9% in January 2016, down from 9.0% in December 2015, and from 9.8% in January 2015.

#### **EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT**

- 8:30 Committee of Inquiry into Emission Measurements in the Automotive Sector. On the agenda: Election of the Chair, Election of the Vice-Chairs (JAN 6Q2).
- 15:00 Committee on Economic and Monetary Affairs. On the agenda: Economic Dialogue and discussion with Euclid Tsakalotos, Minister of Finance of the Hellenic Republic (JAN 4Q1).

- "Cooperation with Ukraine is essential and our solidarity should not be questioned", said European Parliament President Martin Schulz at the opening of "Ukraine week" on Monday evening.

#### **EUROPEAN COMMISSION**

- Yesterday, the Commission launched a 12-week public consultation to gather input on the current regime for registration of interest representatives who seek to influence the work of the EU institutions and on its development into a mandatory lobby register covering the European Parliament and Council of the European Union as well as the Commission.
- Yesterday, the Commission approved a €252.5 million assistance package for Palestine. It is the first part of the EU's 2016 annual support package for Palestine, confirming the EU's long-standing commitment to the Palestinians.
- The Commission confirmed the full participation of Ireland in the EU relocation scheme. In line with its 'opt in' under the Lisbon Treaty, Ireland notified the Commission on 6 October of its wish to participate in both Council Decisions on relocation and to relocate applicants for international protection from Italy and Greece.
- The European Investment Fund, KredEx, and the Estonian Ministry of Economic Affairs and Communications yesterday launched EstFund, a €60 million risk capital fund-of-funds investing in several risk capital funds which will then invest in Estonian SMEs.

#### **COURT OF JUSTICE OF THE EU**

- The Court gave as a ruling on the relationship between the freedom of movement of beneficiaries of international protection and measures intended to facilitate their integration. According to the Court a place-of-residence condition may be imposed on beneficiaries of subsidiary protection if they face greater integration difficulties than other non EU citizens who are legally resident in the Member State that has granted such protection (C-443/14 and C-444/14).
- The Court upholded the freezing of the National Iranian Oil Company's funds for the period from 16 October 2012 until its removal from the list on 16 January 2016.

According to the Court the Council was empowered to freeze NIOC's funds on the basis of the criteria it had laid down (C-440/14 P)
